

## Johnstown Primary School

### Home Learning Programme

**Year:** Nursery

Staff have designed this learning programme in the event of school closure due to national health concerns. The programme is designed to guide parents with activities that will assist with maintaining pupils' Literacy, Numeracy and Cross-curricular skills. The programme provides **suggested** daily and weekly tasks by the class teacher. While the use of the internet is beneficial for the activities, the programme is also designed for those families with limited access.

We encourage parents to spend approximately 2 hours per day with their child/ren on these activities. This will ensure that quality time is spent on the activities and therefore a deeper understanding of the skills developed. Work that is completed can be shared with the class on return to school.

<b>Cross-curricular</b>	<p><b><i>Songwriting Challenge:</i></b></p> <p>Throughout the summer term, pupils will be planting and growing fruit and vegetables in their own area of the school. This is part of an “Incredible Edibles” challenge that schools across the Local Authority are part of.</p> <p>Our challenge is to write an “Incredible Edibles” song that encourages the planting and growing of fruit and vegetables. Use your poetry skills to write the lyrics and rhythm of the song. As well as writing your song, you can make your own recording or even make a video! <b>Cross-curricular</b>	<p><b><i>Outdoor Learning:</i></b></p> <p>During this week, we are encouraging you to make the most out of the great outdoors – in the countryside, the hills, the seaside or even in your back garden. You could measure trees as part of a maths lesson; on the beach look at sand dune formation or brush up on your map skills on an orienteering trail.</p> <p>Wherever you can, you could share your pictures onto your Hwb Account (J2E) to share with your class on your return to school.</p> <p>Try our Tree Measuring Activity to improve your maths skills.</p> <p><b><i>Den Building Activity:</i></b></p> <p>Design your own den on an A4/A3 piece of paper.
